



Doctoral Travel Grant – 10th The International Corporate Governance Society (ICGS)

The Harold S. Geneen Charitable Trust provides financial support to U.S. citizen or permanent resident doctoral students presenting their research during the 10th Annual ICGS Conference. Through this travel grant program, five doctoral students will be awarded \$2,000 grants to cover the costs of travel, lodging, and other expenses incurred for participation as presenter to the main conference or the Paper Development Workshop (PDW).

Objectives

Grants are awarded to U.S.-based doctoral students to meet the costs of attending and presenting during the 2024 ICGS Conference at Arizona State University (ASU), Tempe, AZ, November 9-10, 2024. Students will have the opportunity to present their research and participate in conference activities.

Benefits

Recipients will receive \$2,000 USD to attend in-person the Annual ICGS Conference.

To Apply

- All applicants should submit application package including the following documents to:

 - resume/CV; statement of interest
 - travel budget
 - statement of support from main dissertation advisor. Statement of support should be a 250–300-word statement supporting attendance and how it will benefit your course of study.

Timeline

Applications will open June 30, 2024 and close September 1, 2024. Awards will be announced in the first week of September and funds will be dispersed by September 15, 2024.

Eligibility and Conditions

All applicants are required to:

- Join the International Corporate Governance Society as a student member.
- Present a paper during the Annual ICGS Conference or the Corporate Governance International Review (CGIR) Paper Development Workshop.
- Be a PhD student (within 3 years of completing degree).
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- Work or study at a U.S.-based university.
- If previously awarded a travel grant, applicants must wait at least 2 years before applying for another ICGS travel grant.
- Within 30 days after selection, award recipients must provide a brief biographical statement to ICGS directors.
- Within 30 days after attending the annual conference, award recipients must provide a summary of experience and details of all expenditures from the grant funds.

Items covered for in-person participation:

The travel grant can be used to cover conference registration fees and direct travel costs (such as travel insurance, airfare, train, metro, bus, and taxi), and hotel.

Applicants are evaluated on the following:

- How receiving a travel grant would reduce barriers to participation in ICGS's Annual Conference.
- The unique perspective the applicant brings to the broader ICGS community.
- Applicant's plan to engage with the ICGS community and fellow ICGS student members.
- How participating in the ICGS Annual Conference will benefit applicant's personal and professional goals.
- Applicant's resume/CV.
